* Please submit this first page only filled out at the beginning of auditions with payment. Thank-you. It is with great gladness that we invite you to consider our select dance teams program. For more than 20 years our school has been a leader in dance education in this community. We believe that our success comes as a result of providing solid training and quality service, along with an underlying belief in the strength of our organization.

Each year, we strive to create programs for dancers in our school who show an exceptional interest in dance and desire to be challenged over and above what the regular educational classes may do.

We see our performance team opportunities as privileges. They are for a select group of students who have faithfully trained at Reflections School of Dance and shown an exceptional level of character.

We have created this **handbook** to offer our students and their parents a clear understanding of their commitment and responsibility to the Revolution & Dunamis Teams.

With acceptance into the Dunamis or Revolution Team, your first step to becoming a successful dancer is making a solid commitment to your classes, rehearsals, and performances. Strong technique is a key ingredient and class is where you develop that technique. Come to each class ready to learn, without personal distractions. Class time is your chance to focus on yourself and your development, so try to leave your concerns or worries at the studio door. True progress is made when you look at each class, rehearsal, or performance as an opportunity to become better at what you love to do. Dance full-out, stretch a little further, become more aware of your technique to make the most of every class.

Audition Schedule:

2:00-4:00+ Company & Dunamis & Revolution Team – Most Dancers will be done before 4:00 and may call parents for pick up but be prepared to stay until 4 and there may be call backs or further questions for individuals.

Audition Cost:

\$15 audition fee for each audition.

Audition time exceptions require \$25 additional fee for a private audition if you are unavailable Aug 25. These must be scheduled before Aug. 18th and completed by Aug. 25th. Private auditions will be scored by the same standard as all other auditions.

Audition Day Regulations:

Guests, including moms may not enter the classroom during the audition process. Dancers will be working in front of a panel of advisers and although we love you and want to nurture you, we also want you to have an authentic audition experience.

Application questionnaire will be available before the audition by email by Aug. 1st. Individuals will be expected to have their paperwork *completed* (including parent's signature) *prior* to the audition as well as pre-registered for classes.

Please remember that the use of **cell phones** during the audition process is strictly prohibited. Cell phone use may resume upon the conclusion of the auditions to contact parents and rides.

Music: Dancers are responsible for their own music. It may be run off a CD, iPod or phone but the dancer must have a working knowledge of her/his own device so they can enable it personally. It should have volume up all the way, paused and ready to hit play (with no time-out / password). Adviser's sheet will be marked for music which is not properly prepared.

Dress Requirements:

1. Black camisole-leotard
2. Black jazz pants
3. Hair slicked back in a ponytail
4. We expect a clean, polished look and adviser's sheets will be marked for failure to abide by dress code.

Solo:

Presentation of a 1 minute solo is required. The individual's solo should showcase their greatest strengths as a dancer. Please note that the use of inappropriate music or choreography will result in automatic disqualification. Any questions or help needed may be directed to the Directors.

Self-choreography is preferred. Any help with solos is acceptable however this must be announced just before the solo. Students may inquire to the directors if they wish to hire a teacher for private training.

Group Choreography:

Individuals must be prepared to learn and impressively execute a group lyrical jazz combination as a part of the audition.

Interview:

Individuals auditioning must come prepared to answer a series of questions in their personal interview if requested by the teachers in a call back meeting at the end of auditions.

Commitment:

In the event that a dancer is selected and invited to become a member of one of these groups, commitment is expected. The details are included in this audition packet. Dancers are expected to participate with a high level of excellence and exemplary attitude in all rehearsals and performances over the span of the entire season. (Sept. 1, 2018-Aug. 31, 2019) The only exception for absences is illness with a doctors' note. Bookings of performances and potential traveling dates will be made available in advance.

Some volunteer efforts will be needed from team parents for performances and parties.

Time:

If granted a position one of this year's teams; the following level of commitment is expected going forward from September 1st, 2018 until August 31st 2019. It is expected members would participate fully in the Summer Program 2018 & 2019.

Team rehearsals are 90 minutes weekly. (Revolution, Thursdays 4:30-6:00 and Dunamis Crew, Thursdays 7:00-8:30) Each team member is required to take at least 1 Ballet technique class and 1 other technique class in the dance form of your choice. However more & unlimited classes are strongly recommended to excel in training. Team members not in Ballet 4 should take the Thursday 6-7 Jumps & Turns / special teams advance technique class. Summer Program & all Workshops / Master Classes are required unless excused.

Each dancer will be considered on an individual basis, but the general placement guidelines are as follows:

Dunamis applicants dance at Level 3

14 weeks in the fall for Christmas choreography and performances. Winter and spring rehearsals are for the Benefit Concert, Recital and summer performance prep.

Dunamis will be led by Coach Miss Anna with guest choreographers visiting.

Revolution applicants at Level 4 or 5

14 weeks in the fall for Christmas choreography and performances. Winter and spring rehearsals are for the Benefit Concert, Recital and summer performance prep. Eligible for summer travel opportunity. Revolution will be led by Coach Miss Anna with guest choreographers visiting.

Emerge Dance Company / Apprenticeship

14 weeks in the fall for Christmas choreography and performances. Winter and spring rehearsals are for the Benefit Concert, Recital and summer performance prep. Mentoring, choreography lab and leadership opportunities. Eligible for travel opportunity. Unanimous consensus will dictate potential travel and / or convention / competition opportunities.

Company will be led by Coach Miss Debbie with guest choreographers visiting.

- Groupings of all teams will be re-evaluated over Christmas break.

Attendance Commitment:

Attendance for every rehearsal and performance is **mandatory**. Only in cases of illness with doctor's note would an absence be excusable. Anything outside of these (sports, club functions, extracurricular activities, or homework crises) would be considered an unexcused absence. Upon the accumulation of 2 unexcused absences, a meeting will be scheduled with your team coach & possibly parent in order to re-evaluate your commitment. Missing rehearsed choreography will jeopardize your privilege to perform. Choreography will not be re-taught on behalf of a team member's absence; it is the dancer's responsibility to learn missed choreography.

Costs for the Year:

Fundraising Commitment:

\$150 Benefit Performance Fee – Each Team member will be provided with 15 tickets @ \$10 ea. for the Benefit Performance. The dancer will submit \$150 up front once tickets are made available and they may resell them to family, friends and the community. Extra tickets will be made available as needed.

Attire Requirements:

\$225 Costume and Warm- Up Fee

As a part of the team-exclusive dress code; each team member must own (and properly maintain) **one black camisole leotard, pink convertible tights, one pair of full length black jazz pants, black jazz shoes, and pink ballet slippers**. Additional costumes and warm-ups will be distributed by your coach. Costume/Warm-up fee for the year is \$225 due by October 1st. Any pieces that are damaged or lost during the course of the year are the dancer's responsibility to repair and/or replace at their additional expense.

\$15+ Student Showcase Fee - Family style fun afternoon for students to showcase their own creative works. March 2019

Tuition -1.5 hours (2 hours for Company) for rehearsal time plus the cost of the technique classes you choose, *minus* a ten percent team discount. There will be no additional cost for extra rehearsals as needed or for performances.

Schedule Outline:

September: Team bonding, payments due, contracts signed and turned in. Complete first performance piece.

October: Team & Headshot Photo Shoot, Christmas choreography

November: Christmas choreography. Veterans Day Parade. Assisted Living Performance.

December: Christmas performance season including Seattle Center House Winterfest, Mill Creek Santa Parade, Warm Beach Lights of Christmas, and Reflections "One Uncontainable Gift" at Glacier Peak PAC.

January- April: Choreography and ticket sales for the 2019 **Celebrate Life** benefit performance tentatively April 27 or May 4, 2019 and possibly a couple other winter / spring performances.

May, June: Recital / Summer Prep.

June, July, and August: Summer Dance Schedule, summer outreach performances, and possible (if enough sign up) dance trip.

Attitude Expectations:

All team members are to abide by Reflections school policies. Dancers with a heart of worship for rehearsals and performances is one of the things that sets us apart from other dance teams, causing us to reach the objectives of why the teams exist. This includes; preferring others over yourself and displaying joy and humility during times of instruction. Dancers are expected to treat their instructors and *each other* with the utmost respect. Arriving late to class, rehearsal or any performance is disrespectful to your team and leaders. "Moodiness" should be left at home before attending any team related activity.

Students participating in one of our select programs are expected to consistently exercise the same level of character inside and outside the classroom. Disrespect of this organization that you represent will be dealt with briskly and sternly in the form of immediate dismissal from the team. Financial refunds will not be available.

Please Note: Individual Team placement and choreography placement within teams are done at the discretion of audition evaluators and team coaches. Not every student who auditions is ready or a good fit for a team on any given year. A student may be asked to continue her training and audition again the following year. Once the leaders have made a decision, we would see no reason for a dancer to challenge it but if the dancer were to deem this necessary or would like clarification, this should be done directly with the leader for consideration.

Not every dancer is guaranteed placement in every piece; and in some circumstances, dancers will be asked to understudy. Dancers must trust that leaders are only looking out for what is best artistically, from experience.

Although the dance teams program is a tremendous opportunity we are aware that **it may not be right for every dancer** and we can assist you in decision making.

Reasons why this program might not be a good fit for you:

- You're involved in extracurricular activities that could interfere with your class, rehearsal, or performance commitments.
- You're doing it because you want to keep up with your friends, but you are not passionate about dance nor the commitment.
- You're doing it because your parent(s) want you to.
- You're not fully committed to attending all classes and rehearsals.

Program Benefits

Some of our students do go on to achieve professional careers in dance. For those whom this is not the goal, all students are encouraged to be professional in every aspect of life. This program focuses on educating young people to strive for their personal best in anything they want to accomplish. We achieve our goals for the program by offering young people the chance to:

- gain a sense of balance in life by managing their commitments to both dance and academics;
- participate in a physical activity that enhances understanding of the value of a healthy body;
- develop a sense of confidence when speaking or making a presentation in a public setting, which is also a great benefit in college or job interviews;
- work with mentors who are focused on the students' success inside and outside of the classroom;
- enjoy friendships that could last a lifetime and a sense of belonging to an extended family of fellow dancers, teachers, and parents;
- discover the results of hard work and determination;
- develop a lifelong appreciation for the performing arts and
- gain an understanding of worship in dance and daily life.

In addition, making a commitment to the policies set forth in this handbook teaches our young people that there are boundaries that must be respected in order to succeed here and in life.

*Dancers will be notified within one week of auditions regarding the advisors decisions. If you are invited to be a part of a team, you choose to accept or deny the invitation. If you are unable to commit to the policies and team calendar, acceptance will be denied.

We are excited for you now as you may very well be entering the most rewarding dance year of your life!

Addendum:

We approach this new season, expecting the best out of everyone and everything involved.

With these new opportunities I desire to make the expectations clear, realistic and attainable. Once a student has auditioned and accepted an invitation to one of our select dance programs I will expect nothing less than cheerful compliance. As young professionals at work, you will be treated like young professionals and you will be expected to act as young professionals. Dancers may not add to or alter the guidelines according to personal interpretation.

Some statements below may seem strong but please know that it is in the best interest of both the teams and individuals that I would state these guidelines and not be afraid to follow through.

The following may seem obvious to some dancers, but not obvious to others so I am clarifying.

- **Dress Code** for performance and pictures is non-negotiable. Make-up, hair, shoes and the way the costume (including accessories) is executed must be uniform for a clean, polished look. No jewelry, fitbits, or bands of any kind on wrists. Students who choose to create a personal interpretation of the costume will be asked to properly change.
 - For rehearsals, students should be in their blacks with the appropriate shoes for that choreography. Extra layers may be worn for warm-up time but after 20 minutes the students will be asked to remove the extra layers.
- **Lateness** is unacceptable.
- **Missed Rehearsals** is unacceptable.
- **Talking** during class is unacceptable.
- **Bad Report** is unacceptable. We emphasize zero tolerance for gossip which includes texting, group chats and sharing your negative opinions or “feelings” on group outings. One might think that “venting” in the hallway, through social media or texting is a way to calm down but the truth is, this only spreads negativity to those who hear or read your opinions, affecting the moral of the team.
- The standard **Social Media** policy is re-listed below.

I sense that with the increase of media communication, feelings of isolation have rapidly increased to a dangerous level causing young people to feel insecure and unsupported. This is the opposite of any result we would hope to obtain for our teams. We desperately need community and it is my heart to build a safe environment where the dancers can thrive without the fear of..... So, we enforce these safety guidelines with no apology.

Some of the activities included in our rehearsal schedule will include face to face friendship building communication.

Student and Parent Use of Social Media / Group Texts / Communication:

Use of Facebook, and other online social media vehicles is commonplace. This policy is intended to provide Reflections School of Dance students and parents with guidelines to eliminate any confusion concerning the use of social media / group texts / communication.

You DO NOT have permission to reveal any information that compromises Reflections School of Dance or the Teams. By that we mean you are forbidden to share personal information about the director, other students or their families, or anything that is proprietary and/or confidential to them or Reflections School of Dance.

- Team members and families do not have permission to share or duplicate contact information from teams list.

- Students and parents should neither claim nor imply that they are speaking on behalf of Reflections School of Dance or Team
- Never post anything that could compromise the self-esteem of another dancer.
- Only the Reflections office has permission to post videos or class rehearsals for training purposes.
- Respect the law, including those laws governing defamation, discrimination, harassment, and copyright and fair use. Parents and students should never post negative comments about other schools or teachers. Ensure that your social networking conduct is consistent with all Reflections policies and values.
Your social networking behavior is representative of Reflections School of Dance and God.
- This includes texts, group chat any communication from your personal devices.

Disrespect of the social networking / communication guidelines results in the termination of your position in the dance team. Please do not be offended if asked to depart.
